Brothers,

I am writing this morning to ask for your continued support in our efforts to rebuild our Eagle Village. The devastating damage caused by Hurricane Ian, finding damage to a few trees and 5 carports completely destroyed from the winds of 125 MPH. The major damage caused by the storm was to the 30-year-old roofs throughout the village. The Insurance Company has made their assessment of the damage but at the time of this letter no report available from the company. Age and condition of damage prior to Ian, (depreciation), the insurance company could pay a partial amount to replace the damaged roofs on these homes in Eagle Village, (10% to 50% of replacement).

The average cost to replace these roofs is around 7000.00 per roof, (61 roofs), complete tear off and replacement of each, materials, and labor. These donations need to be designated specifically to the repairs to the damage caused by Hurricane Ian.
